

Directly Speaking

Hello Region 10 Directors!

I hope all of your rehearsals are going well in preparation for contest. Best wishes to all of you and your awesome choruses for a great experience on that stage. The following rehearsal tools and tips are written by Paula Davis, member of the International Faculty, Certified Expression Judge, and International Board member. They are a great way to add variety and fun anytime to your practices. Enjoy!

Tools & Tips for Effective Rehearsals

To Break Tedium (The Natives are Restless!):

- Have one side of the chorus watch and listen to the other side
- Put the front row on the back row and have everyone move down a row while singing
- Have a few folks come out and watch/listen
- Have quartets sing/demonstrate what you're doing
- Run off the risers and back on in 10-20 seconds
- Have someone different do something in front of the chorus
- Have all Jan April birthdays do something: choreo; sing; etc. (then other months to follow)
- Use rhythm instruments in a rhythm song or up-tune (for rehearsal)

To Build Characterization and Showmanship:

- Sing in Concentric Circles and sell to one another (moves circles on a clap)
- Show other choruses' contest videos for inspiration (without sound will highlight showmanship better)
- · Show a movie or film clip for inspiration on your contest songs
- Sing to a partner on the opposite side of the risers from where you are
- Employ theater games to help loosen up or find ways to show emotion
- Have a member that's doing really well come down and demonstrate

To Build Chorus Unity and Spirit:

- Have a "Queen for a Night" award with nominations from members where the recipient wears a crown for the night presented by the nominator and why she gave it
- Have a "Smile" award given by members to anyone who makes them smile
- Have vocal part cheers, colors or skits basses; leads; tenors; baris
- Do theme nights wacky hats; beach night; contest themes
