Our Winter Regional Meeting will be Jan. 16-17, 2009, with Sandie Nason. Sandie is the director of the Canadian Showcase Chorus (Region 16), and comes with a lot of experience teaching at International Education Symposium and around the globe. She will be teaching classes for the general membership titled "Music as Therapy" (managing stress), "Ring and Resonate" (rehearsal techniques for singers and musical leaders), "Sing Me a Story" (the importance of lyrical interpretation) and others.

Sandie will be talking with the directors and musical leaders about "How Did It Get To Be Half Past January" (planning for the next few months as we approach the contest season), and a class for quartets on "Becoming An Overnight Success." Our regional education faculty will be teaching classes on Pythagorean tuning – what it is and why it is important, how to tune chords – why that helps all four categories, looking at music to identify traps in the vocal lines, and much more.

We will also be introducing a new regional song – complete with learning CDs – which we will be us-

ing in classes at the summer area schools (see below). We are considering several titles now, but it will be a fun song to learn and to sing -- something new and different. Be the first to get your copy and your head start on learning the new regional song. There will also be classes and networking sessions for administrative leaders -- there will be a lot of education for EVERYONE so plan now to attend! You won't want to miss it.

MOCK QUARTET CONTEST IN JANUARY

This will also be a weekend providing education for our registered quartets. Quartets will receive classes on costuming, how to make your entrance to the stage with energy and enthusiasm (which sets your level higher without singing a single note), and other topics. You will receive two coaching sessions – one vocal and one visual. And the evening show will include a MOCK QUARTET CONTEST where a panel of REAL judges (Janie Macchiaroli, Sound; Mary Ann Wydra, Music; Jackie Hall, Expression; Janet Burnett, Showmanship) will evaluate your

performances and give the quartets a LEVEL. You will not receive a score and there will be no "placement" but you will get great comments to help you continue your preparation for contest.

The show will start earlier than normal – exact time to come when we see how many quartets we will have. And on top of that, we will once again be having the Young Women In Harmony quartet contest

we refunded if they returned the music and learning CD furnished in their info packet.

Each week we focused the Workshop lesson on specific vocal production techniques; i.e, posture, breathing, vowels, consonants, tuning, blending and staging, while learning a song. The last night of the workshop, we put on a "mini show" where we performed the song complete with choreography. We expected to have some drop-off over the four-week course but 9 women made it through the full course to receive their graduation certificates and a cool Austin Harmony tote bag. Five of the 9 are now coming back with plans to join the chorus as full members and two others will join us for our Holiday Community Chorus.

Speaking of the Holiday Community Chorus, this will be our 4th year to invite women to join us for several rehearsals where they learn a few Christmas songs and they then perform with us on our up-coming Christmas Shows.
