UNIT SOUND

Unit sound occurs when TONES ARE PROPERLY PRODUCED, ACCURATELY TUNED, BLENDED and BALANCED. We are talking LOCK AND RING.

The sound judge rewards a performance wherein:

All singers consistently apply techniques of good vocal production

Total accuracy exists both **horizontally** within individual part lines and **vertically** within individual chords. Vocal qualities are blended both within chorus sections and within the overall quartet or chorus unit, culminating in a composite, well-produced, musical sound

Cone-shaped balance of voices or sections is maintained. Overall application of vocal and stylistic technique enhances the identifiable characteristics of the barbershop style, resulting in a musical performance in the sound category.

POSTURE

BREATHING

Relaxed jaw, relaxed, open throat and erect, expanded rib cage.

Mastery of breathing will accomplish more than any other single factor in improving the caliber of vocal production in all four categories.

PHONATION

Swallowing muscles, bearing down muscles, locked knees (not ever)

RESONATION

Relaxed jaw, open throat and elevated soft palate

It will feel different to each singer

ARTICULATION

Notes, intervals, chords, tuning, intonation

Intonation in the sound category refers to the physical production of the tone

Focus and clarity

SECTION/PART ACCURACY

SYNCHRONIZATION

Instant locking of the chord

VOWEL PRODUCTION

"Vowel modification" to achieve barbershop balance and blend

Brighter more forward vowel as the pitch descends

More neutral approach at the high end of the tenor range

SECTION TO SECTION BLEND
